ITV Meridian news recently reported on the drop in availability of affordable housing in areas of outstanding natural beauty – such as Wye – and in National Parks. In a short interview I was able to highlight the difficulties that local young people face when looking for their first home and how our village has become out of reach to many.

Difficult Times

It is hard to escape the effects of the new Coronavirus on the way we live. The vast amounts of advice and information are overwhelming. It is not surprising that people are concerned. This period will create some huge challenges for many individuals and businesses.

Yet, despite the overblown reactions of some, the Wye community is stepping forward with coordinated offers of help for those who may be vulnerable or in need of support. Look out for information through your door or contact the parish council.

Borough Council

Ashford Borough Council (ABC) is closely monitoring the emerging situation and reassures its residents that the council has contingency plans in place which set out how services will operate during any disruption to normal business.

ABC's key responsibilities are to protect our communities (especially those who are vulnerable), its staff, maintain priority service delivery and assist our business communities where possible.

Ashford Borough Council has its own equivalent of the national "COBRA" committee and I am proud to be part of this important group, helping to make the, often difficult decisions that will keep our daily lives as normal as possible.

ABC is repeating the advice from Public Health England and encourages residents to follow this in order to protect themselves and others. As this advice is constantly changing as this awful situation progresses, I will not repeat it here. 

Council Notes for April

At the time of writing, fresh updates of preventative health measures, closures, postponements and cancellations are appearing thick and fast. Councils both large and small up and down the country are doing their best to continue with their business as usual and provide essential services to the public. The government has introduced a number of measures to support councils, including an extension of time to complete our annual financial audit and in addition has noted an intention to consider whether meetings can take place virtually during this period of restricted activity.

Wye with Hinxhill Parish Council, met on Tuesday 16 March to agree proposals to allow business to continue to be conducted, with a view that the situation is changing day-by-day. Acting within its powers the Council will take appropriate steps to ensure that it has the flexibility to function, and respond to threats and challenges quickly, based on the most up to date advice available. Myself as Clerk, along with the Deputy Clerk and nominated councillors will handle routine executive matters and have the flexibility to respond quickly to the changing needs of its residents, and to support local businesses and services. A range of changes in working practices and other practical public health precautions have already been implemented, by the council. Regretfully, the Annual Parish meeting planned for 28 March was postponed. The current situation does not allow for a new date to be set at the present time. Work on current projects such as the Wye Flyer community mini bus will for the moment be scaled back – but are ready to be taken up again with gusto as soon as is possible.

On behalf of the Parish Council, please do whatever you can to stay well and whatever you are doing please consider the implications for yourselves with care. Do everything you can to support friends, family and neighbours and, importantly look after yourselves.

THE WYE AND BROOK INDIA TRUST

Helping to educate children in Delhi Registered Charity 288217

The Trust was founded in 1978 by Rev David Marriott, a previous vicar of Wye Church, and channels money from donors chiefly in the UK to Delhi, India. The funds support the education of girls and boys from 5 to about 18 years' old, whose parents would not otherwise be able to afford it.

The schools, which have been run for more than 40 years by the Delhi Brotherhood Society in a poor sector of Delhi, were started when there was little government investment in education for the poorest children in the city, and many children remained uneducated. The schools have a very good reputation and are now licensed by the local authorities. Recently, additional years have been added allowing the possibility of enrolling in university education, or technical training.

Rates of literacy have been greatly increased in the area. When people see that educated children often have a better future because they can read and write, they are more inclined to send their own children to school.

Quite apart from the question of whether large gatherings of people would be allowed, there was the possibility that Spring Grove School might not be able to open on time for its summer term.



It may be accessed through the surgery website (wyesurgery.co.uk) and it enables patients to submit their symptoms electronically 24 hours a day 7 days a week and receive a reply by the next working day either by text message, email or telephone. e-Consult was piloted by GP practices in the West of England and is now used by over 1200 GP practices, including other practices in the Ashford Primary Care Network.

The app requires patients to answer a series of questions and the answers will sign-post them to the most appropriate care, including a face-to-face appointment, self-help, advice from a pharmacy or a simple administrative response (a sick note or access to test results without the need for an appointment). e-Consult includes a Red Flag alerting system that identifies potential critical illnesses and fast-tracks GPs' responses.

One advantage of the new system is that it will remove the need to queue up on the telephone at 8 o'clock in the morning, as it can be submitted at any time of the day or night.

It is also timely, as surgeries are facing unprecedented demand as a result of the

corona virus pandemic. e- Consult will allow patients to have access to clinical advice from GPs without having to come into the surgery, reducing the risk of infection spreading to other patients and/or to surgery staff.

The new system should reduce waiting times before clinical decisions are reached and could release more GP time for face-to-face appointments. e- Consult is a more advanced system than 'Ask my GP' as it allows more space for free text to describe their symptoms. It is also safer for the patient allowing the Doctor to identify urgent cases quickly, rather than risking them being the last in a telephone queue when all the appointments are gone for the day. Clearly, not all patients can use the Internet and there are separate arrangements for children under 6 months old.

Online consultation services do require a change of culture and mindset as we move away from the traditional visits in person to the Doctor, but online technology is capable of offering innovative new ways of maximising the clinical resources we have available.

NET ZERO EMISSIONS BY 2030

The need to reduce carbon emissions, and to do so as quickly as possible, is on a lot of people's minds at present, including the Church of England.

Our very own Canterbury Diocese passed the following motion at its November Synod.

This Synod recognises the Environment and Climate Emergency, and commits to the following:

- Learning the facts about today's environmental degradation and human-induced climate change;
- Speaking the truth about the Emergency and the changes that are needed to safeguard the environment and mitigate climate impact;
- Taking the necessary action to reduce greenhouse gas emissions to net zero by 2030, and to model ways in which our faith and congregations can enable all of God's creation to flourish;
- Fighting social injustices caused by the environmental crisis;
- Implementing the Diocesan Environment Policy 2019 and Action Plan;
- Including our Care for the Environment within our diocesan Changed Lives Changing Lives strategy.'

Various other dioceses around the country are making similar commitments. Furthermore, at the February General Synod, the resolution was passed calling on all parts of the Church of England 'to work to achieve year-on-year reductions in emissions' and 'to reach net zero emissions by 2030'.

'Net zero' means looking at our carbon footprint and balancing the negative greenhouse gas emissions, mainly from burning fossil fuels for heating and lighting, with the positive things we can do, such as switching to renewable energy and planting trees.

Achieving net zero emissions by 2030 is a tough goal, but one that we need to tackle if we are serious about limiting the overall rise in global temperature to 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels (as recommended by the UN Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change Report, 2018). *Our Diocesan Environment Working Group is currently looking at how we can implement the motion to achieve the commitments. It will require everyone, all churches, working together for this common aim – our care for God's creation.*

At Wye Church, we have and continue to carry out a range of actions to reduce our emissions. Our electricity and gas is bought from a supplier of renewable energy and last autumn we had an energy audit undertaken to see where we might reduce emissions even further. A current project is replacing the lighting in church to LED.

WYE HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Nearly 60 people came to the Wye Historical Society February meeting to hear Dr Emma Hanna speaking on "Sounds of War: Music in the Armed Forces During the Great War". Based on her forthcoming book, Dr Hanna focused her research on performers (both servicemen and civilians), music in hospitals, makeshift theatres, and in groups such as the Salvation Army and the YMCA. Music was made for a variety of reasons, including fundraising, morale and for religious services. Some of those who joined up were already professional musicians - in 1914 there were 3 million pianos in the UK and 30,000 brass bands. In 1857 The Royal Military School of Music was opened at Kneller Hall in Twickenham and was the home of Army music. In the Navy boys learnt on the job until 1903 when the Royal Naval School of Music was founded at the Eastney Barracks in Portsmouth. The Territorials and new army regiments didn't have their own bands, however, so there was no one to play at their point of departure. Sometimes the Salvation Army filled this gap as a lack of music was seen to be dangerous. Music was also used for recruitment and fundraising, and patriotic song sheets were issued. John Mackenzie-Rogan, a bandmaster of the Coldstream Guards, used public spaces in London as ad hoc performance spaces to encourage deposits in the Great War Loan savings account. For a long time there was no official music at the front for marching. In 1915 Rogan wanted to take a band over to France; this was agreed and he led three tours of three months each in 1916, 1917 and 1918. For Rogan this was the highlight of his military career and the King even prevented his retirement.

The supply of instruments was haphazard and depended on charity. Many instruments for informal mess performances were improvised such as tin kettle drums and petrol cans.

Popular songs included lullabies and ballads as well as some more bawdy numbers. Morale boosting songs were common, as well as those which mocked the Germans and their own officers' leadership. Gramophones were used in dugouts, ships, aerodromes and hospitals to play classical music, dance numbers and jazz. Music was an important part of entertainment provisions behind the lines provided by the Salvation Army and the YMCA. There was a piano in every YMCA facility and, as they wanted to control what was played, each hut was issued with the YMCA piano album.

Some professional musicians were allowed to travel to France, such as married duo Ellaline Terriss and Seymour Hicks, leading names on the Edwardian stage. They were only allowed to perform away from the front, such as in a casino in Boulogne commandeered to serve as a hospital. There was an expectation to perform for free but they still had to make a living. Dame Clara Butt believed performers should be paid and that entertainment was as important as "beer, beef and books". Concert parties ranged from the highbrow to those performed by the men themselves, often with the help of women's underwear and wigs. Many professional musicians and performers joined up, so by the end of the war every division had a concert troupe with names such as 'The Whizz Bangs', 'The Jocks' and 'The Tivolies'. In POW camps music was sometimes used to hide escape attempts - during one concert while the tuba was played a tunnel was being dug under the stage.

This year is the 250th birthday of Ludwig van Beethoven. It's very rare for human achievements to outlive their creator for more than a generation. To still be held in high esteem after 100 years is really some achievement. But, after 250 years, to be widely regarded as one of perhaps two or three of the most extraordinary musicians to have ever lived is really something!

Great artists matter because they show us deep truths about ourselves and about the world we live in. The amazing thing is that, though Beethoven was composing around 1800, his music still remains as fresh, relevant and important to us today as it ever has done.

I will be talking about, and playing some of Beethoven's piano sonatas in Wye School in May (date tbc).

I'll select three sonatas from the three creative periods of Beethoven's life, putting them in context, and ex- Pencil drawing of Beethoven by Izzy King plaining why they still matter to us today.



Whether you're a Beethoven fan or whether you've never consciously heard a note of his music (apart from the beginning of Fur Elise – a piece he considered so unimportant he never even bothered to have it published - or the famous 4 notes at the start of the 5th Symphony) may I cordially invite you to come along and find out what the fuss is all about! MICK'S COMPUTER CHAT

Power Issues

Again not directly IT but this is a very current issue. Power cuts and fluctuations. These are not good for the PC or you internet connection. I always recommend using a special surge protected extension lead. But beware these are not all created equal. I think it is best to use the one type that protects against both power surges and possible lighting strikes, not all of them do. The cheaper leads just have surge protection.

The lead I would recommend is the Belkin one. It is available on Amazon or at some supermarkets. **Belkin BSV401af2M 4 Way/ 4 Plug Surge Protection Extension Lead** with 2 x 2.4 A Shared USB Charging Port, 2 m Cable – White.

Simply plug the surge protection strip into any AC wall outlet and connect up to four AC and two USB devices to keep them safe from power surges, lightning strikes and AC contamination. £22 on Amazon. Ideal for laptops, desktops, printers, routers and other home-office devices, the Belkin Surge Protection lead is made with high-quality circuitry and premium absorptive materials to protect your electronics and data. You should have one of these protecting you PC or laptop and one protecting your broadband router if it's in a different part of the house.

While on the subject of power cuts living in the country it seems to be just part of life. I have now assembled our "Power cut emergency kit" and it lives in the top of a cupboard in the kitchen and very useful it is. It consists of:

1 set of **Vdealen Unisex's LED Battery Powered Emergency Lights.** Very useful they come with a hook to hang them from, quite bright, put then in places not suitable for candles, hallway, toilet, kitchen etc. You get 4 in the pack and the batteries seem to last for ages. I put the batteries (3 x AAA) in them when they were new and haven't changed them since. **£8.99** on Amazon (*Use bold descriptions to search on Amazon*)

1 Milestone Camping Whistling Kettle Ideal if you have a Calor gas hob. Not much to say about this just an old fashioned whistling kettle. £8.50 on Amazon

And then last is the **Work Light Rechargeable LED Flashlight Emergency Light**A rechargeable torch that is always available. Again holds its charge very well and is very bright on max but has three different settings.
Has a hook, is magnetic and has USB's so it can charge phones etc.
A very useful bit of kit. Ours is just hung up in the conservatory in case I need to check the garden at night. **£12**



Someone may ring saying they are from the bank to say there is a problem with your account. They will ask for your password. Banks never ask for it. Never, ever give out your password – this is a scam.

The other scam frequently seen is the freebie scam. This is a free trial of a product for a fixed period. If the date at the end of that period is not recorded and the contract is not ended, the product will be charged for after that date. Remember you don't get something for nothing!

Cold calling offering investment information selling, is a scam. It is illegal in UK to do so.

The scam many of us have had, is a call from HMRC saying we have underpaid tax. If we don't pay at once over the phone, giving bank details, the police will be sent with an arrest warrant for you. Scam – HMRC always write, never phone to discuss tax details.
